Young Mary of Nazareth had the unique privilege of being mother to the very Son of God. Because angels don't usually make appointments, we can understand her puzzlement and anxiousness at Gabriel's greeting and declaration. Mary did not doubt his message but could not see how pregnancy would be possible. Her faithful response to the Gabriel reflected her inner courage and faith as a willing servant of the Lord. Although she faced many challenges along the way, including giving birth in a stable, she remained steadfast in her calling as the mother of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

5.	What do you feel is the greatest challenge in yielding or surrendering to God's will?

6.	Look up Psalm 123:2, it is a reference to a handmaiden and her relationship with her mistress. What did the handmaiden do?
