 Read Acts 4:32-35 for an eye-opening look at the early church. How does the idea of belie pooling their resources for the common good strike you?

 Describe any instances where you've seen such selfless generosity work in your own corr of the world, maybe between neighbors or within families, if not in whole congregations. 	
 What practical reasons might you offer for not sharing everything with one another in you church family? 	⊦r

2.	Now read Acts 5:1-2. What do you think motivated Ananias and Sapphira to give their money to the apostles?
	Why do you think they kept some for themselves?
3.	Read Acts 5:3-4. What excuses do you suppose Ananias and Sapphira gave each other to justify their subterfuge?
	• It seems that money wasn't the real problem. What key word appears in both verses, clearly pointing to Ananias' sin?
4.	Grace and forgiveness seem in short supply in this biblical story. Read Acts 5:7-10. Do you think Peter should have told Sapphira what had happened to her husband before she was asked the fateful question? Why or why not?
5.	Read Acts 5:8 carefully. What indication do we have that Sapphira may have been given the chance to set the record straight here?
6.	Read Acts 5:5 and Acts 5:11. What outcome is recorded in both of these verses?
7.	What does Acts 5:14 tell us about the growth of the church after this memorable incident?

2.	Now read I John 3:17-18. How do these verses describe how true love is expressed?
3.	Read Acts 2:44-45. How could we as God's church be more loving - specifically, more generous - with one another?
4.	Read Philippians 3:7-9. How could the needs of your heart be met in a more godly fashion, rather than through public recognition of giving?
