I. When God’s people are stressed, He promises comfort.

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Isaiah 40:1

A. Assurance in our hearts that our hard service – warfare is completed, our sin is paid for, justice is done. (Isaiah 40:2)

II. There is good news in the wilderness. Jesus provides and guides

The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God... Mark 1:1

A voice of one calling: “In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.” – Isaiah 40:3 and Mark 1:2-3

“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.” – Isaiah 43:19
