A. A disciple loves the teacher.

D. A disciple aspires to live out their eternal purpose.

***In a wealthy home some utensils are made of gold and silver and some are made of wood and clay. The expensive utensils are used for special occasions, and the cheap ones are for everyday use. If you keep yourself clean [transforming]... you will be ready for the Master to use you for every good work.*** — 2 Timothy 2:20-21

***Anyone who builds on that foundation [salvation through Jesus Christ] may use a variety of materials — gold, silver, jewels, wood, hay, or straw. But on the judgment day, fire will reveal what kind of work each builder has done. The fire will show if a person's work [character] has any value.*** — 1 Corinthians 3:12-13

E. A disciple trusts the teacher and the teachings in hard times.

***Abraham never wavered in believing God's promise. In fact his faith grew stronger... He was convinced that God is able to do whatever He promises.*** — Romans 4:20-21
