- A. We have a tendency to drift away from God.
- B. Some people walk away from their relationship with God.
 - People walk away from God for <u>selfish</u> reasons.
 - Others walk away from God because they don't like the "whole package of the Bible"
 - A very small percentage of people have a historical/factual dissidence with Jesus, his
 ministry and resurrection.
- C. And when it comes to character development drifting needs to be <u>addressed</u>.
