Discussion Questions: Focus Who? - Responding to God's love – Romans 5:1-11

Drawn from the September 8, 2024 sermon by Dr. Jeff Chandler

Opener: If you were to measure your identity in terms of God's love, what would be something you are especially grateful for that he has done in your life?							
The SCC Missions statement reads: Responding to God's love by inviting people to join us as we become more like Jesus.							
Today's study will help us in understanding the attributes of God's love that we are seeking to emulate. Ask someone to read Romans 5:1-11							
I. God's Love – What does it look like?							
A. God's Love Embraces:							
You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Romans 5:6							
What does the statement "at just the right time" convey to you about how God uses our circumstances to awaken us spiritually?							
2. The kind of people described in this verse can be described as weak, helpless, ungodly, sinners, and even enemies of God. Have you ever seen yourself this way? If so, how did you feel God's "embrace" and receive his mercy in your life?							

B. God's Love Restores:

For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

Romans 5:10

4. The idea of restoration also conveys a change of ownership. Jesus bought us from sin's bondage and restores us to God as his own possession. What does this mean to you?

These verses describe what happens when someone is restored by God

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! 2 Corinthians 5:17

"Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." Psalm 51:10

5. Talk about how God has renewed you and made something new out of your life.

C. God's Love Satisfies:

Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us. Romans 5:5
